Our aim is to provide gymnastics opportunities for all ages and abilities across the East Midlands.

The region is made up of 5 counties starting in the North with Derbyshire, then into Nottinghamshire across to Lincolnshire, then down to Leicestershire, and finally finishing with Northamptonshire in the South.

The EMGA accounts for one of the 10 regions that form the English Gymnastics Association that in turn is the regional arm of British Gymnastics. We work as one organisation to provide opportunity and development for our sport both regionally, nationally and internationally.

To help the region function we have a regional exec team consisting of a Chair, a Treasurer, Secretary and Regional Welfare officer. In conjunctions with the exec there is the BG development team consisting of an Area Manager and several representatives to support clubs. The development team actively work with the regions clubs to ensure we can help our clubs and disciplines meet the demand of our customers, now and in the future.

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Competition details – Overview

Welcome to the **Gymnastics for All – East Midlands Regional Competitions**, within this pack you will find all the details to participate within our competitions, support by British Gymnastics.

The aim of these gymnastics competitions is to provide an opportunity for gymnasts across the East Midlands to participate within a fun and low-pressure competitive environment. These competitions break down the 'Key Skills' involved in General Gymnastics and builds them up towards more challenging skills which gymnasts love to do in various environments.

These competitions are linked to various disciplines but are mainly linked to the club level and county level competitions within the region.

Who can enter?

This competition is for:

Boys and girls aged 5 years and over (see specific competition details).

The entry age for the gymnast is the **age of the gymnast on the date of the competition**.

For example: A gymnast needs to be 6 years old before the 3rd March 2019 to enter 6 years category within the U8's Floor and Vault competition.

All competitions are open to all clubs who are members of the East Midlands Gymnastics Association.






Type, level, and pathway





Entry details

Method of entry

As of July 2018, the East Midlands Regional competitions will be completed via online entry only.

Please see the section '<u>Dates</u>, <u>Competition</u>, <u>Level</u>, <u>Venue</u>, <u>Address</u>' of this document for the appropriate web links to be able to start the online entry process.

Note: There is an online entry guide available on each competition details page for those who haven't gone through this process before or in some time previously. You can also contact the 'Key Contacts' for support if you are still experiencing any technical difficulties.

Method of payment

This is part of the online entry process and uses the British Gymnastics online payment system.

Entry dates

Individual competition details can be found within the <u>Dates, Competition, Level, Venue, Address</u> section of this document.

Note: The competition organiser holds the right to close the entry period early, if the maximum entries have been reached.

Late entries

Entries after the closure date will incur an administration charge for the processing of the entry. Depending on the individual situation the entry may not be accepted.

Changing of a gymnast involved in the competition

If a gymnast is unable to attend the competition for a specific reason (injury, illness etc.) then you are welcome to transfer (change) the gymnast so you maximise the opportunity for your club.

To transfer a gymnast in this competition, please go onto your online entry to make the amends to your entry.

All changes must be completed prior to the entry closure date. No changes will be accepted after the closure date due to constraints within the programme organisation etc. If a gymnast becomes unable to enter the competition anymore, please see section on Withdrawal of entry for details on how to do this.

How to transfer a gymnast – Online entry (GymNet) process

You're able to un-submit your entry and remove/add gymnasts as much as you wish to until the entry deadline. Once you have paid for an entry you are unable to add/remove gymnasts. To add/remove a gymnast after paying for the entry you will need to contact the competition organiser as they will need to manually alter the entry (this may incur an admin fee).

Withdrawal of entry

Online entry (GymNet) withdrawal process





Please un-submit the entry online, this will withdraw your entry. If you have paid already need to contact the Competition Organiser to discuss how to withdraw, depending on the stage of withdrawal.

Fees to withdraw

If the withdrawal is:

- After the closure date A fee may be charged, please contact the Competition Organiser to find out this detail.
- **Before the closure date** No fee will be charged as part of consumer rights.

Confirmation of entry

Upon entry and payment of entry; you will receive a confirmation email for your entry.

Structure and programme

Confirmation of programme

After the entry closure date, the competition organiser will finalise the competition programme/running order and circulate this with all clubs involved.

If you haven't received an email of the competition programme five days prior to the competition start date, please contact the competition organiser.

Note: Sometimes emails can get moved to 'junk mail' boxes without our knowledge, please check prior to contacting the competition organiser.

Notes:

- Depending on the number of entries in each category after the closing date, some categories are subject to change. For example; 7 years may become two groups of 7 years, Jan Jun born and Jul Dec born. This may also work in reverse, for example; 5 and 6 years will join as there are only 2 in each age group entered.
 - This will be down to the discretion of the Competition Organiser, but this will be fully communicated prior to the competition date.
- The entry age for the gymnast, is the age of the gymnast on the date of the competition





- To compete in the 6-year age category the gymnast must be 6 years old by the date of the competition
 - **For example:** A gymnast needs to be 6 years old before the 3rd March 2019 to enter 6 years category within the U8's Floor and Vault competition
- To compete in over 8 years competitions in fairness to all gymnasts, the coach and gymnast should decide at what level gymnasts compete (Primary 2, Primary 1, Advanced or Advanced Plus).
- 8-year-old gymnasts have the choice of entering the Under 8's competition or the Primary 2 and above competitions. The coach and gymnasts are to decide this ethically.
- Disability gymnasts to enter categories to suit age and personal circumstance. If unsure, please contact the Competition Organiser who will be happy to work guide you.

Gymnasts that have...

- Entered Woman's Artistic Floor and Vault competitions must enter Advanced (or higher)
- Entered Woman's Artistic Floor and Vault competitions and won a medal must enter Advanced Plus
- Entered Gymnastics for All Floor and Vault competitions and won a medal must move up a level in the following year
- Entered Gymnastics for All Four Piece competitions and won a medal must move up a level in the following year
- Entered Woman's Artistic County or Regional four-piece competitions Level 5 or above or Regional/National Grades and / or Tumbling National 1 at or higher are not eligible to enter General Gymnastic competitions
- Competed at Club Grade 6 and 5 can enter
- Been a former Artistic Gymnasts wishing to compete at a lower level may do so, but must not have competed for **one year**, and enter at the Advance Levels

Note: The last point, is on the discretion of the coach and should not advance the gymnast beyond their level or hold the gymnast back for the success of the club. Owing to the big jump in difficulty between Primary 1 and Advance this rule does not apply.

Apart from the above restrictions, you may enter any gymnasts at any level e.g. a gymnast could enter the Floor and Vault Advanced – Girls although they have never entered a competition prior. Thus, keeping in mind the physical and psychological factors involved with entering a gymnast at a higher level as their first time.



Any appeals of a judge's Difficulty Value (DV) score decision need to be given to Alex Shaw and must be submitted prior to the end of the competition.

Appeals must be submitted by the gymnast' coach only.

Facilities on-site

Spectator area and disabled access

Neither New College or Amber Valley have any on-site entertainment facilities apart from the sport of gymnastics. If you have small children, you may wish to bring something to keep them entertained.

First aid and welfare

A trained Welfare Officer will be present throughout the competition – This person will be highlighted during the coaches and judges' briefings.

A trained First Aider will be present throughout the competition – This person will be highlighted during the coaches and judges' briefings.

It would be most helpful if the supporting coach from each club is first aid trained (you can never have enough first aiders on-site), but this isn't essential.

Regulations

Standardisation

Unless stated these regulations have been created to help standardise competitions within the North of the Country.

Etiquette

While competitions can become competitive, please ensure you support every gymnast, coach and parent/guardian involved. Everyone has been involved at some point and every competition/event is a celebration of those efforts.





It is important that the access to the 'Officials area' (judges, scoring, music etc.) is restricted authorised personnel only.

Photography

It is your responsibility as the coach in charge of your entered team/club to be aware and have records of anyone that can/can't have their photo/video taken for media purposes. If you have anyone that can't please make the competition organiser aware prior to the date of the competition for they can inform the appropriate persons at the venue, so photo/video are avoided of them.

In line with British Gymnastics Photography Regulations, photos/videos may be taken but only used for personal use and must not be shared on social media if other gymnasts are also on the video even if just in the background. Clubs need to ensure parents/carers are aware of this.

If you have any gymnasts or coaches that can't be involved in media (photographs, videos etc.) please ensure you state this against their name on the entry form.

DE Photography will attend all the competitions and photos can be purchased on the day.

At **no point** should flash photography be used as this can affect the gymnast's performances, judge's concentration and those with epilepsy.

Complaints and grievances

If you have a complaint or grievance regarding any happenings at this competition, please ensure you send in your details to the Competition Organisers email within five working days of the competition date.

If there is a problem on the day of the competition, the competition will go ahead as programmed, and the problem will be addressed at a later date after the competition with the parties concerned.

The parties with the grievance will meet the committee to see if an amicable decision can be made for the good of all parties and Gymnastics for All Committee.

It will then go to a committee vote.

If no agreement can be made the Chairman will make the final and binding decision.

Health and safety

Overview





The health, safety and welfare of all participants (gymnasts, coaches and officials) is the primary consideration. All British Gymnastics policies and procedures will be rigorously applied with regards to health, welfare and safeguarding and protecting children.

The intention of the competition is to create a friendly and no-stress/low-pressure environment for all those involved, while allowing gymnasts the opportunity to challenge themselves to do their best. Ensuring the safety of the gymnasts, no matter their age, is a priority in the event set up, programme design, and risk assessment, using the guidance set out by British Gymnastics in its Safe Coaching Practice document – https://www.british-gymnastics.org/documents/clubs-schools-and-leisure-centres/8851-h-s-guidance-safe-coaching-1/file

Risk assessments

Risk assessments have been carried out for this competition but if you feel there is something/one that may require additional assessment please contact the Competition Organiser ASAP with specific details.

While risk assessments for the competition have been completed, your club is responsible for specific risk assessments related to your club e.g. travelling to and from the competition etc.

Welfare

As part of your risk assessments and preparation for the event, please consider the welfare of individual gymnasts, including such items:

- Clothing not being revealing/embarrassing for males, females, and transgender gymnasts/coaches/judges.
- Age of gymnasts when changing, socializing etc.

The British Gymnastics Health, Safety and Welfare policy has guidance on such areas and there are a few videos/courses which may help you also:

Emergencies

As part of event, everyone attending must adhere to the emergency procedures and follow the professional guidance of the competition organiser and members of staff from the venue. Below is a brief guide of the venue emergency procedures.

At Amber Valley and New College

Coaches must remain in charge of their gymnasts, leading them out the nearest fire exit and to the appropriate meeting point (see signage in venue).

Spectators will leave via the nearest emergency exits in an event of an emergency.

Judges are to support the coaches in leaving the venue with their gymnasts but to report to the head judge once at the appropriate meeting point.

At New College (specifically)

In the event of the emergency alarms sounding please evacuate via one of the following routes:

- Spectators Use the emergency exits at either side of the seating
- Gymnasts, coaching, and managers Use either of the three emergency exits in the main hall
- Café Follow the emergency exit signage to the South Entrance car park emergency exit route

Meeting point is in the South Entrance car park.

At Amber Valley (specifically)

In the event of the emergency alarms sounding please evacuate via one of the following routes:

• These will be highlighted on the day during a safety briefing

Coaches are to ensure all their gymnasts are kept together until registered and then handed back to their responsible adult.
