



About Acrobatic Gymnastics

Acrobatic Gymnastics could be described as an infusion of choreography and complex acrobatic skills performed in partnership on a standard gymnastics floor area. Balance, Dynamic and Combined routines are performed to music. The floor area is 12x12 metres; Duration of the routines is 2 minutes, 30 seconds.

Great Britain is one of the most respected nations in Acrobatic Gymnastics and has achieved success at World and European level with medals in all categories.


DISCIPLINES

Men's Pair, Women's Pair, Mixed Pair, Women's Group, Men's Group.

Gymnasts work in harmony and trust, each responsible for their partner or partners. It is a true and testing examination of human relationships. Routines impose on gymnasts a need for strength, agility, flexibility, balance and acrobatic skills. The results are spectacular; intricate balances performed on partners, exciting multiple somersaults and twisting somersaults with partners being pitched and caught. A requirement and opportunity to express their artistry and individual gymnastics skills makes this a delight for spectators, and a tremendous feeling of attainment for gymnasts.

HISTORY

Acrobatics was first introduced to Great Britain in 1974, it was known then as Sports Acrobatics which included Tumbling, competing on the World stage under the banner of International Federation of Sports Acrobatics (IFSA). The sport remained as such until 1997, when Tumbling was incorporated with the sport of Trampoline and Acrobatics became an independent sport. Both then became members of the Federation of International Gymnastics (FIG).





Pat Wade

Professor Patricia Wade MBE was one of the founding members of Acrobatic Gymnastics. She devoted her entire life to sport, fostering participation, education and gymnastics in its many forms. Pat's career was nothing short of outstanding, interspersed with many successful projects, awards of recognition and responsibilities at every level of the national and international sport hierarchy.

Attracted to sport from an early age, Pat initially participated in swimming and hockey before Artistic and then Acrobatic Gymnastics prevailed to win a place in her heart. Her lifelong interest in gymnastics began whilst she completed her teacher training. Originally training as a coach she displayed skills in many disciplines, Artistic, Trampoline, Rhythmic, Gymnastics for all and Acrobatics. Pat soon took her knowledge and skills a step further becoming a much sought after Acrobatic judge on the international circuit as well as becoming a member of the British Gymnastics Sports Acrobatics Technical Committee and the International Federation of Sports Acro (IFSA). During the IFSA-FIG merger in 1999 Pat was elected as President of the FIG Acrobatic Technical Committee, a position that she held for 8 years.

Her enduring passion for Acrobatics has seen the sport through many transitions and developments into a vibrant and immensely exciting discipline that is now one of the most prestigious sports throughout the World. Pat's quest for honesty and clarity helped create an opportunity for all athletes to compete under fair and equal rules. Diligence and hard work held no fear for a special lady who exemplified perfection and excellence in her pursuit of true sportsmanship.


After years of illness which Pat endured with dignity and courage she sadly passed away in November 2010. The death of Pat left the British and International gymnastics community with a loss and a legacy equally immeasurable. Her wisdom, judgement, humour, dedication and enthusiasm gave us all a spirit for life to aspire to and it is this memory that the Pat Wade Classic is dedicated to.



40th Year Anniversary

It was 40 years to the day, 23rd November 1973 that the constituent congress of the International Sports Acrobatics Federation, later to become known as IFSA, first convened. Under the leadership of the great Yuri Titov, [USSR] and other founding fathers, including John Atkinson, MBE, the sport was nurtured under IFSA until in 1999 when it merged with the Internationale Federation de Gymnastique, [FIG]. The merger was designed to assist acrobatics on its journey

toward Olympic representation, but sadly to date this has not come to fruition. The work of the European Union de Gymnastique, [UEG] and the persistence of the Acrobatics Technical Committee, under the leadership of Laurie Colton, has seen the discipline rewarded with membership to the 1st European Games, Baku [Azerbaijan] endorsed by the European Olympic Committee. Acrobatic Gymnastics' journey towards Olympic status is one step closer.





